EYFS

Children learn to experiment with different tools and materials. They complete observational drawings and self-portraits.

Children create art works with natural materials

They learn about colour mixing, printing and painting.

They develop collages using different materials.

They celebrate and talk about their own creations.

Year Five

Typography & Maps

Exploring how we can create typography through drawing and design, and use our skills to create personal and highly visual maps.

Mixed Media Land & City Scapes

Explore how artists use a variety of media to capture spirit of the place

Set Design :Explore creating a model set for theatre or animation inspired by poetry, prose, film or music.

Architecture: Dream Big or Small?

Explore the responsibilities architects have to design us a better world.
Make your own architectural model.

Year Six

2D Drawing to 3D Making

Explore how 2D drawings can be transformed to 3D objects. Work towards a sculptural outcome or a graphic design outcome.

Activism

Explore how artists use their skills to speak on behalf of communities. Make art about things you care about.

Exploring Identity

Discover how artists use layers and juxtaposition to create artwork which explores identity.
Make your own layered portrait.

Year One

Spirals

Using drawing, collage and mark-making to explore spirals. Introducing sketchbooks.

Exploring Watercolour

Exploring watercolour and discovering we can use accidental marks to help us make art.

Making Birds

Sculptural project beginning with making drawings from observation, exploring media, and transforming the drawings from 2d to 3d to make a bird.

Year Four

Storytelling Through Drawing

Explore how artists create sequenced drawings to share and tell stories. Create accordion books or comic strips to retell poetry or prose through drawing.

Exploring Pattern

Exploring how we can use colour, line and shape to create patterns, including repeating patterns.

Exploring Still Life

Explore artists working with the genre of still life, contemporary and more traditional. Create your own still life inspired art work.

The Art of Display

Explore how the way we display our work can affect the way it is seen.

Brave Colour

Exploring how artists use light, form and colour to create immersive environments.

Year Two

Explore & Draw

Introducing the idea that artists can be collectors & explorers as they develop drawing and composition skills.

Exploring the World Through Mono Print

Using a simple mono print technique to develop drawing skills, encourage experimentation and ownership.

Music & Art

Explore how we can make art inspired by the sounds we hear.

Year Three

Gestural Drawing with Charcoal

Making loose, gestural drawings with charcoal, and exploring drama and performance.

Working with Shape and Colour

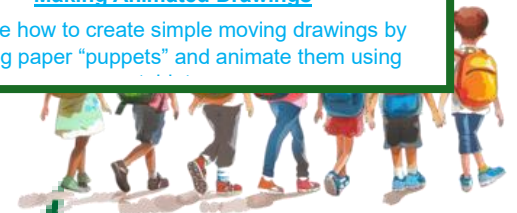
"Painting with Scissors": Collage and stencil in response to looking at artwork.

Cloth, Thread, Paint

Explore how artists combine media to create work in response to landscape. Use acrylic and thread to make a painted and stitched piece

Making Animated Drawings

Explore how to create simple moving drawings by making paper "puppets" and animate them using



Intent

At St Luke's Park Primary School, we nurture creativity and self-expression, encouraging pupils to explore a wide range of artistic techniques and traditions. Pupils are inspired to communicate visually and appreciate the role of art in culture and history.

Implementation

We follow a scheme called 'AccessArt' which was developed by artists and focuses on the process of creating artwork and individual interpretation of themes and ideas. Rather than focusing on creating finished artworks which closely resemble each other, we aim to empower children to develop their own style and have confidence in the fact that art work is not 'good' or 'bad' but that every piece of work gives us something special and everyone who views it will draw a different impression from it.

Children are taught the skills that they need to enable their artistic expression. They use sketchbooks to develop ideas or experiment with different media.

Finished artworks may be displayed or taken home by children to share with their families.

Impact

Pupils at St Luke's Primary School will develop confidence in expressing themselves artistically and a lifelong appreciation of art. They will leave with strong technical skills and respect for the diverse cultural influences on artistic expression.
