Intent

At St Luke's Park Primary School, we foster a love of music and provide opportunities for creative expression. Pupils explore singing, playing instruments, and understanding music from various genres and cultures, enriching their appreciation of the art form.

Implementation

Music is taught weekly.

We use a scheme called Charanga which gives us a platform to share a wide range of music with children, inviting them to engage with and reflect on their own opinions of this.

The playing of chime bars/glockenspiels throughout ks1 and moving on to recorders in ks2 supports children's musical development.

Children are taught to recognise musical notation and record their own musical compositions.

Children develop their voices through singing assemblies each week and via the Charanga scheme.

There are performances planned in to each key stage with a Christmas show for EYFS, nativity or equivalent in KS1 and carol concert for KS2.

Lower Key stage 2 prepare for a performance at the end of the spring term and upper key stage 2 for a performance at the end of the summer term.

Impact

Pupils at St Luke's Park will leave with musical skills, confidence in performance, and an understanding of diverse musical traditions. They will develop a lifelong appreciation for music and its power to inspire and connect.
